Türkiye-Syria Earthquake Relief: Rescues Dwindle 9 Days in as Focus Shifts to Recovery

International Blue Crescent Relief and Development Foundation would like to extend our sincere condolences to all those affected by the earthquakes this week. IBC employees in the region are safe and accounted for, though some have lost family members and loved ones and saw their entire homes destroyed. Thank you to all who are mobilizing and to the heroic search and rescue teams on the ground. Immense and continued cooperation is needed to prevent further loss of life and suffering.

Day 9 Developments

Communities from around the world continue to mobilize in southern Türkiye and northern Syria to provide urgent relief for over twenty million people affected by last week's 7.7- and 7.8-magnitude earthquakes which occurred hours and kilometers apart on Monday February 6th. The current number of deaths reported is 41,209 including 35,418¹ in Türkiye and 5,791 in Syria (4,377 in Northwest Syria alone). This number is likely to rise significantly as personnel on the ground shift focus to recovery efforts. It is estimated that thousands of people still lie under the rubble in the hardest hit areas of Iskenderun and Antakya in Islahiye/Gaziantep, Hatay, Elbistan/Kahramanmaras among other areas.

The number of people who survived with injuries has reached 115,546; in Türkiye 105,505 of which 13,208 are still under medical treatment, and 10,041 reported injured in Syria including 7,962 in the Northwest¹. According to the Government of Turkiye, 47,000 buildings examined were beyond repair and have begun demolishing. These 47,000 buildings contained 211,000 apartments housing on average 4 to 6 people per home (average household size for Turkiye in the southern region is 4², and 6 for Syrian families³ respectively). The most affected provinces of Kahramanmaraş, Gaziantep, Sanliurfa, Diyarbakir, Adana, Adiyaman, Osmaniye, Hatay, Kilis and Malatya and Elazig continue to be under a state of emergency for the next three months. According to the Ministry of Interior Disaster and Emergency Management AFAD as of Tuesday, 195, 962 residents from the 10-city zone had been evacuated to other provinces⁴ and the Government of Turkiye estimates that over 2 million people have evacuated by their own means. In Syria, it is reported that 11,000 homes were

completely destroyed within 1,700 buildings, with an additional 6,213 buildings partially destroyed or uninhabitable including 2,100 in Afrin, 1,900 in Harim, and 970 homes in Jisr-Ash-Shugar⁵.

It is estimated that 1 million people in the region have lost their home⁶ which emphasizes the urgent need for more shelter in the harsh cold winter temperatures for the few hundred thousand still unable to be accommodated in the 227,762 family tents coordinated through AFAD and designated centers at capacity, in addition to the 195,000 already evacuated. A total of 3,170 aftershocks have been reported since the two earthquakes, further prioritizing a scale up of psycho-social support in all relief efforts. AFAD reports four mobilized Social Service Centers in Kahramanmaras, Hatay, Osmaniye, and Malatya with 3,682 personnel deployed providing a total of 256,605 persons affected with psychosocial support (221,651 inside / 34,954 outside of the 10-province affected zone). IBC community center tents will also provide psychosocial support. Like all stakeholders providing any relief in the area are required to do, IBC coordinates with AFAD and Turkish Red Crescent and in concert with the relevant stakeholders including UMKE (medical teams), assigned governance and local stakeholders including International Organizations and local Non-Governmental Organizations.





Homes and buildings completely destroyed in Malatya and Hatay

The Government of Turkiye reiterated today as part of its relief efforts for its citizens that it will provide 100,000TL to families of those deceased from the earthquake, as well as reimburse for travel expenses and accommodation for up to one year. The President of Turkiye has also announced that the shelter needs of 1.6 million earthquake survivors from the area of 13.5 million affected have had their shelter needs met, of which 890,000 are in public dormitories and facilities and 50,000 in local hotels. With immense relief efforts still, nine days in, shelter from the cold February winter is urgently needed for thousands of families in addition to basic needs for the confirmed 211,000 completely destroyed households so far where residents lost everything in the destruction.

Meanwhile today the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) released its flash appeal for the whole of Syria, calling for emergency earthquake relief funding

requirement of \$397.6 million dollars to meet the needs of 4.9 million in the most acute need, mainly in Northwest Syria (population 4.5 million)⁷. According to the appeal, 30 rapid need assessments had been completed in the aftermath of the earthquakes in Northwest Syria by NGOs as of 12 February and at least four cluster specific, and one multi-sectoral assessment are ongoing, results forthcoming in the next days. Besides confirming number of deaths, injuries, and building damages, the most urgent needs at this time include heavy machines for debris removal, tents and Non-Food Items (NFIs), and heating material and fuel for hospitals. Preliminary assessments indicate that the sub-districts of Harim, Afrin, Atmeh, Sarmada, Atareb, and Kafr Takharim are among the worst hit areas.

Unlike Turkiye, before the earthquakes, Syria already hosted the highest number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) in the world (6.8 million estimated), with nearly 80 percent displaced for at least five years and further, 85 percent of households were unable to meet their basic needs in 2022. Household movements are expected to continue as people seek new shelter after this disaster, but in the war-torn region there are few stable options left and families will likely continue to battle cold weather in another round of temporary shelter. Relief efforts have significantly scaled up in the past few days as the UN has negotiated with the President of Syria for two additional border crossings as their regular crossing had been damaged in the earthquakes. It was reported that at least five major deliveries of much needed medical, shelter, food, winterization, and other items have reached Northwest Syria so far but more urgency and scale up are needed to prevent further loss of life and suffering in a place where 90 percent of the population relied on humanitarian aid before the earthquakes as well as coping with a rising cholera outbreak and stretched thin medical support.



IBC in the Field

IBC Team with support from IDRF Canada Distributes Food Packages to Earthquake Survivors in A'zaz/NWS

International Blue Crescent Relief and Development Foundation (IBC) has been on the ground this past week in the familiar provinces of Gaziantep, Kahramanmaras, Kilis, Hatay, Sanliurfa, and A'zaz/Northwest Syria. IBC released a <u>full response appeal</u> two days ago and will continue with ongoing assessments this week in Adiyaman and Suruc as well. Thousands of people who lost their

lives are still under the destruction. Many people are still on the streets and require basic needs support especially winter items and some form of shelter to guard from the cold winter air especially in Hatay, which was completely flattened. As IBC has already been implementing humanitarian and development programs in most of these locations, we have worked together since the first hours after the earthquakes to coordinate with AFAD, Turkish Red Crescent (TRC), local municipalities and governance, and local stakeholders in our established networks in the most affected zones to provide emergency response including hot soup, hot meals, emergency items and basic health check from our Kilis Community Center. IBC staff in Northwest Syria have been busy the past few days with support from partners Action Medeor and IDRF Canada to deliver food kits and blankets to hundreds of earthquake survivors in newly set up tents in coordination with AFAD in A'zaz/Aleppo.

Distribution will continue tomorrow in A'zaz as there are many more families in need. After completing the distribution in A'zaz today, IBC Team visited an older camp called Fateh in Kafra, a nearby village with population 17,000. Previously this camp had 82 tents set up but now after the earthquakes 72 tents were added this past week for more families who survived the earthquakes. The families mainly came from Sarmada, Afrin, Jandiris, and A'zaz / Aleppo. IBC Team learned that this camp needs non-food item (NFI) kits (sponges, blankets, floor insulation, and kitchen utensils) and will discuss undertaking this. Further, IBC Team discussed solutions to the <u>water sources damage in Soran village which the team had assessed the previous day</u>. IBC continues to coordinate directly with AFAD and Turkish Red Crescent at the designated crisis table for improving shelter, blankets, food, basic needs, winter items distribution, and development of community center tents.

Additionally, this morning IBC attended the Northwest Syria OCHA Cross-Border Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) Cluster meeting where colleagues updated cluster partners from the previous day's assessment of Soran and surrounding villages, as well as IBC plans to solve the water issue at request of local council and Turkish Red Crescent. The Clusters that IBC participate (FSL, WASH, Health) all have begun holding ad-hoc meetings either every day or every other day in these first days of earthquake response. According to this morning's WASH meeting, WASH facilities are overrun in hospitals and health facilities particularly in Harim, Sarmada, and Dana. An increase of infectious disease is expected in the area due to the dire WASH and health situation and there have been many reported cases of acute diarrhea. Moreover, as IBC team saw firsthand in Kafra, overpopulation is expected to occur in camps in the coming days as people evacuate due to flooding from a broken dam and internal migration to safe places. Lastly, many water systems had been shut down due to electricity cuts in the first days but this issue has been mostly resolved however,

electricity companies say electricity is being channeled to critical needs like bakeries and water systems, so electricity to other areas is unstable with frequent outages.

In this second week of the earthquakes response, IBC's 24/7 work on and behind the scenes securing funding and coordinating procurement of the most urgent items at scale in coordination with trusted partners, in addition to the relief delivered every day since the earthquakes hit, tomorrow it is planned to receive delivery of 4,000 blankets, 8,000 meals + 8,000 compote, 3,000 jars of food, 1,000 each diapers/baby wet wipes/baby bags, 50 cartons of hygiene kits, 100 baby care kits, 100 food kits, and 300 canned food items for the earthquake survivors. In addition, tents, WC container, living containers, mobile kitchen set-up, and generators are all expected in the coming days as we continue to develop the community center tents in IBC operational locations (see maps below). These activities fall under the <u>full response appeal</u>; however, we have reached just 21 percent funding in this appeal and will continue to seek support as we work with our generous partners to allocate their provided support according to the developing needs on the ground.

Meanwhile, activities continue at IBC Kilis Community Center with provision of hot meals of 6,000 meals 3x per day at distribution points Cumhuriyet Square and Erdogan Meydani under agreement with Turkish Red Crescent, AFAD, and partner MSF. IBC is also still providing food and basic needs distribution support to the 9,000-person capacity shelter at Sanliurfa exhibition center. Over the past few days, basic needs, winter items, baby care items, and thousands of blankets have been distributed with partners in Antakya/Hatay, Elibstan/Maras, and Islayihe/Gaziantep where IBC visited and started to set up community shelters with kitchen and continue doing distributions with support of partners. IBC will also implement a mobile component in these areas to reach nearby villages and are planning to visit Adiyaman and Sanliurfa Suruc district in the coming days for further assessment.

For immediate needs, based on IBC team field assessment, focus continues to be put on canned foods and other non-perishable food items. Hygiene packages, sanitary toilets, shower cabins, soap and dry shampoo, materials for mouth cleansing such as toothbrush and toothpaste or mouthwash are also essential needs and finally, underwear for all ages especially children is urgently needed. Shelter provision is still urgent as fatal gaps persist. Additionally, winter items are crucial to distribute as soon as possible including tent or prefabricated units, baby care kits, thermal clothes, blankets,

generators, and fuel. Thousands of people are still homeless in the freezing cold conditions even among evacuations.

For earthquake survivors, IBC is working tirelessly to provide food, water, shelter, warmth, and essential needs. Headquarters staff, in concert with global partners, are mobilizing flows of vitally important medical supplies, food, hygiene kits, and basic needs equipment to fulfill the needs of the earthquake victims. Personnel on the ground continue to operate crucial, lifesaving operations while plans to expand and intensify activities are finalized. For now, IBC Kilis Community Center continues to serve as a major hub for coordination and relief efforts, including for cross-border response into Syria.


As a result of the assessments undertaken by IBC field staff and partners so far, **IBC has been taking the following actions:**

- Daily hot meal distribution in Kilis, 6,000 meals 3x/day
- Hot meal and blankets distribution started in NWS- in total 40,000 including 20,000 in Türkiye and 20,000 in NWS
- Establishing hot meal and food parcel distribution center in Hatay
- Delivered 4,000 thermal blankets to Gaziantep
- Provide wheat flour to Sanliurfa Municipality Halk Ekmek, distribute bread freely
- Establishing a shelter center of 200 prefabricated components in Hatay and Kahramanmaras and undertake all needs
- Support municipality in Sanliurfa for shelter housing 9,000 people; deliver baby food and diapers, sandwiches, blankets

IBC Activities in development in Türkiye:


Multiple Locations

- IBC plans to be operational at Kilis, Sanliurfa Center, Maraş Center/Elbistan, Islahiye and Nurdağ/Gaziantep and 2 locations in Hatay Center and Kirikhan to be determined later in contact with local authorities
- In addition to community center tents already set up in Kilis and Sanliurfa, IBC will also establish in Kirikhan/Hatay, Elbistan/Kahramanmaraş, and Nurdagi and Islahiye Gaziantep, four community centers initial plan to run for 6 months
 - From each center, daily food, hygiene materials, blankets and hot meals for 1,000 people will be distributed
- Mobile teams of five staff are in five cities in Karahmanmaras, Gaziantep, Kilis, Hatay, Sanliurfa are continuing assessment for more programs
- IBC plans to establish prefabricated camps around the four community centers units of 100
 prefab houses with all sanitation and other facilities with a potential to expand to 500 houses
 and run them for at least six months
- Immediate distribution of relief items in Hatay (blanket, food, hygiene, etc. to be decided by IBC according to ongoing assessments)
- Hot-meal distribution in Kilis IBC Community Center, Sanliurfa Community Center that already continue and at the newly established community centers in Kirikhan/Hatay, Islahiye and Nurdagi/Gaziantep, Elbistan/Kahramanmaraş and will continue for 6 months. Each community center will provide hot meals to 1,000 persons daily
- Medical checks, treatment, and provision of basic medicine will be available in the community centers too by employing a doctor and a psychologist

- Mobile health consultation (A team of a driver and a nurse; to visit families living on the streets, to do health checks especially for children and elderly, to call an ambulance or organize the transport if deemed necessary); In each city in total four mobile health consultation teams will be in force
- Distribution of 20,000 blankets in Hatay, Gaziantep, Kahramanmaras, Sanliurfa, and Malatya
- 20,000 Monthly food parcels distribution in Hatay, Kahramanmaraş, Gaziantep, and Sanliurfa
- 20,000 Hygiene packages distribution in Hatay, Gaziantep, Şanlıurfa and Kahramanmaraş
- 5,000 heaters to be distributed in all four provinces

Even after nine days, needs in the region are overwhelming. Medical and general evacuations continue to take place; shelter/tents, thermal clothing, heat, water, power supply, and medical aid are still *urgently needed*. The damage done to roads and infrastructure has made many areas simply unlivable. As personnel on the ground are tasked with recovering the deceased and evaluating structural damage, the relief efforts to meet the hundreds of thousands of displaced residents must be scaled up immediately, especially for the most vulnerable women, children, elderly, persons with





Additionally, on February 7th, IBC Cross-Border Programs Manager Mr. Muhammed Assaf and Ridvan Wesim of MSF Doctors without Borders held a meeting in IBC's Gaziantep office with the Chief Physician Dr. Fadıl Ersoy and his team about the health situation in the city of **Kilis.**

The patients' cases were as follows:

Intensive care patient 16.

Service patient 45.

There are currently 40 patients in the emergency department.

The currently death in Kilis 22.

In total, the number of patients who came to the hospital during the earthquake was 480.

The number of patients referred to Kilis is 120, and the referrals are from provinces close to Kilis (Hatay, Gaziantep, İslahiye, Kırıkhan, Nurdağı).
